
The Spread Eagle

Open all day with the wedding showing on both TV screens. Food is being served all day and revellers are invited to join in the spirit of things by decking themselves out in red, white and/or blue garb. There's live music in the evening from popular vocal duo **Without a Doubt**.

Open all weekend for a mini beer festival with a range of local ales, perrys and ciders. On the 29th, the wedding will be showing on the big screen in the bar and food will be served all day. Around Corby Walking Festival (30 Apr to 2 May)



Now in its third year, the Around Corby Walking Festival encourages people to get out and enjoy the local countryside.

There is a 34 mile circular network of footpaths connecting the seven parishes of Corby Borough and there are walks to suit all fitness levels and abilities. This includes a 5am walk in Fineshade Woods to the sound of the dawn chorus, a leisurely stroll soaking up the local history in Gretton or Corby Old Village, or a more challenging 14 mile walk taking in the lovely villages of Great Easton, Stockerton, Lyddington and Gretton.

There will also be a Community fun day at **East Carlton Country Park** on **Sunday 1 May**, where you can bring your favourite teddy bear for storytelling and a walk around the park!

News from Cottingham Parish Council

A look back on the year

The Chairman's Report and 2010/11 Accounts were the two main topics on the agenda at April's Annual Parish Meeting, which preceded the main Parish Council meeting. Here's a short extract from Chairman Pete Bowman's report .

"The past year has seen a lot of activity by the Parish Council working behind the scenes in a wide range of areas. We've made sure the Borough and County Councils – and any other relevant agencies – are aware of all remedial highways, environmental, infrastructure and conservation works that are needed around the village.

"This ongoing activity has been identified and acted on by the Parish Council, either as part of its routine village walks, or in response to direct requests from villagers. As a dedicated group of councillors, we're proud to say that our work doesn't just stop at the end of our monthly meetings.

"The Parish Council is still pursuing Quality Council status and we're now confident that we can meet what is an extremely comprehensive list of criteria. Hopefully 2011 will see Cottingham become one of just 12 Quality Parish Councils in the county.

"Rounding off, I'd like to thank all my fellow councillors for the work they've done over the past year – in particular Vice Chairman Cllr Clive Ashworth, whose considerable experience and expertise we continue to rely on.

"There are also those people who are not councillors but still make a valuable contribution to the Parish Council and the village in general, including Tree Warden Jon Dixon, Footpaths Warden Diana Sharvill, Speedwatch Co-ordinator Mike Curtis and grounds maintenance contractor Steve Morphy.

"And special thanks must go to PCSO Mark Tooley who is very active and visible around the village, and makes sure we're all aware of Police-related activities in the area.

"Thanks again to our councillors for all their good work and I'm sure this will continue for the coming year. "

Cottingham Parish Clerk Peter Taylor hit a milestone recently with 25 years distinguished service to Cottingham Parish Council.

The anniversary was celebrated at a surprise 'meeting' where councillors clubbed together to present Peter with a silver and gold Cross fountain pen as a mark of their appreciation and gratitude.
