#### Planning application refused

An update from Cottingham and Middleton Parish Councils

At a meeting of their Development Control Committee on 20 January, Corby Borough Councillors voted unanimously to refuse the outline planning application for the proposed housing development on land to the rear of Bury Close.

The Chairs of Cottingham and Middleton Parish Councils, as well as Pete Bowman from the Cottingham Community Action Group and Noel Rogers from East Carlton Health Walking Group (pictured below) spoke out at the meeting to air villagers' concerns about the proposed development.

Owen Davison, Chair of Cottingham Parish Council, said: "We are delighted by this decision. This planning application drew massive opposition from the villagers of Cottingham and Middleton, as well as from agencies like English Heritage, the Wildlife Trust, The Campaign for the Protection of Rural England and the Ramblers Association. We are aware that the applicants may consider appealing, but we're ready and prepared for the next stage if they do."

The Parish Councils would like to thank Jane Smith and Pete Bowman for their work in leading

the action group which has co-ordinated the campaign against this development and helped prepare the presentations to the Development Control Committee.

Items covered include scams inviting people to part with their money in return for lottery or competition prizes which don't exist, threats from bogus debt collection agencies and 'begging letters' from fictitious charities.

Middleton Parish Council now meets on Tuesdays and their next few meetings will be held at 7.30pm in the Village Hall Annex on 17 March, 21 April and 19 May. Villagers are welcome to attend – the first section of each meeting is open for members of the public to raise issues or ideas.

Dog fouling continues to cause concern and the Parish Council is working closely with Corby Borough Council to identify those who are not picking up their dog's mess and, if appropriate, ensure they are fined for this anti-social behaviour.

Traffic speed through the village and parking on The Hill have also been subjects of discussion, and the Parish Council has asked that the speed gun is utilised in the village as part of the Rural Days of Action programme between 9 and 11 March.

## Update on local planning policy

North Northamptonshire is currently consulting on its strategic planning priorities for 2011 to 2031 and has laid out the principles on which it would base any development on land west of Corby (between the A6003 and the A427). Much of this land falls within the far reaches of Middleton's parish boundary.

Although this development is not imminent, both Parish Councils feel it is important that they comment on this document, which will inform local planning policy.

## Village hall and recreation field

Middleton and Cottingham Parish Councillors, and representatives of the School and the Village Hall Management Committee, are working together on the Working Group which is planning the new Village Hall and improvement of the Recreation Ground. The Skate Park, that was consulted on last year, forms part of this initiative.

A planning application has been submitted to Corby Borough Council for the new Village Hall.

The Group is currently consulting Sport England and Northants County Council on how to improve the sports facilities, while making sure that the strict rules on protection of playing fields are adhered to.

Wed 4 March – Great British Sewing Bee winner Heather Jacks will be sharing her story and talking about 'GoSew', her project to encourage children to sew.


