Bury Close planning appeal

The planning appeal hearing for the proposed housing development on land to the rear of Bury Close was held at West Glebe Sports Pavilion in Corby on 4 and 5 May.

The hearing, which lasted a day and a half, included a visit to the proposed development site and the grounds of Cottingham Hall. The Planning Inspector, Mr Tim Wood, also walked the footpaths surrounding the villages





Villagers were represented at the hearing by Owen Davison (Cottingham Parish Council), Sarah Brant (Middleton Parish Council), Jane Smith (Editor of Cottingham and Middleton News), Noel Rogers (East Carlton Walking Group) and Simon Woods who is a town planner and brother of a village resident.

We would like to thank our local MP Tom Pursglove for again writing to the Planning Inspectorate in support of the villages' opposition to this development.

A decision is expected in early to mid June. Keep an eye on the village website for the latest information.

Royal George re-opens

Following repainting, re-carpeting and re-upholstering, The Royal George is now back open for business as a free house pub, restaurant and B&B.

New owners **Kevin and Debbie Gibson** have run a pub before and most recently ran the cafe at the Innovation Centre in Harborough. Before that, they ran the sandwich shop at the top of St Mary's Road in Harborough.

No 67 bus service to be withdrawn

Due to budgetary constraints, Northamptonshire County Council (NCC) is due to withdraw the funding subsidy for the No.67 Gretton to Market Harborough bus service that runs through Cottingham and Middleton.

Service operator Centrebus has advised that without this funding they will unfortunately no longer be able to provide this service, as the revenue generated would not cover their costs. The service will therefore be withdrawn from 24 July.

NCC is considering what alternatives may be available for affected communities, subject to funding being available, and is liaising with borough and parish councils on this. If you have any thoughts or concems, please contact a member of your local parish council (see lists on page 2).

The RF1 Corby to Uppingham bus service will not be affected.

Yellow lines in Cottingham

Make your views known - Parish Council meeting, 7pm, 1 June 2016

As you're probably aware, there are now double yellow lines in the village at the junctions of Corby Road, Church Street, High Street and Rockingham Road.

If you feel strongly about these yellow lines, either in favour or against them, please come along to the next meeting of **Cottingham Parish Council** on **Wednesday 1 June** in the Village Hall Annex, Berryfield Road, Cottingham, to make your views known.

The Parish Council has agreed to start the meeting earlier at **7pm** to allow 45 minutes for public participation on this matter.

Background

Northamptonshire County Council (NCC) has advised that the proposal for the introduction of the lines was made in response to issues initially raised by Cottingham Parish Council, Corby Borough





Council (CBC) and our local PCSO. In addition, villagers' responses to the parking survey carried out by CBC in early 2014 highlighted concerns about parking at the top of Church Street, which was affecting bin collections and access in the street, and safety and visibility issues caused by parking outside the shop.

In response, NCC submitted a proposal to Cottingham Parish Council and, at their October meeting, the Parish Council unanimously agreed to support the proposal for yellow lines with two amendments. These were to remove the lines outside the village shop and the lines that originally extended further round the corners into School Lane.

NCC's Senior Traffic Engineer has advised that the lines were originally proposed for all the corners at the crossroads (and not just the two corners where problems had been identified) to counteract 'displacement', i.e. that once you paint yellow lines in one place, people start parking on other corners where they might not have parked before. However, when the Parish Council requested the removal of the lines outside the village shop, these 'displacement' lines on the corners of Rockingham Road, Corby Road and School Lane were still left in.

NCC carried out a 21 day public consultation on the proposals from 19 November to 10 December 2015, which involved a notice on the site, an advert in the local newspaper and letters sent to the properties fronting the yellow lines. Details also went out to the village email list on 1 December and were included in the village newsletter published on 3 December.

The consultation received 11 responses – some in favour and some against – which NCC pulled together into an objection report for consideration by Cottingham Parish Council. At their January meeting, the Parish Council agreed to stick to their original decision, supporting the proposal subject to the amendments that they had previously requested.

Note: Historic England supports the removal of yellow lines in conservation areas due to the visual intrusion that they cause and advises that, where they are deemed to be essential, they should be painted thinner and in a paler primrose or cream colour. NCC has confirmed that they will consider removal or reduction of the lines on instruction from the Parish Council. See the village website for more information.

New village hall

Following April's Annual and Ordinary meetings, eight trustees have been appointed to the Management Committee to oversee proposals for the new village hall, which will now be sited on the Village Acre on the Recreation Field.

The trustees are Pete Bowman (Chair), Tony Freeman (Vice Chair), Irene Beadsworth, Sarah Brant, Mike Curtis, Owen Davison, Jo Leaning and Simon Medwell.

Extended conservation area adopted

The Cottingham and Middleton Conservation Area Appraisal and Management Plan SPD (Supplementary Planning Document) was adopted following approval by Corby Borough Council at their Local Plan meeting on 27 April 2016.

This followed a second public consultation that ran run for six weeks in February and March, attracting 23 responses. The first public consultation, which ran last autumn, attracted 46 responses.

The extended conservation area joins the previously separate Cottingham and Middleton conservation areas and covers a wider area, including some of the land surrounding the built areas of the villages which has been identified as forming an important part of the villages' historic and rural setting. This includes the piece of land between Cottingham Hall and the Jurassic Way.

Del Robertson, who currently co-ordinates the newsletter deliveries for Middleton, has decided to hand over the mantle after several years' sterling service.



It's rocket science for Cottingham schoolchildren!

Cottingham C of E Primary School is taking part in an experiment to see how seeds grow once they've been into space. 2kg of rocket (*Eruca sativa*) seeds were sent into space with British astronaut Tim Peake and, after six months in microgravity, have now returned to Earth.



This national project, aptly called 'Rocket Science', is a partnership between the Royal Horticultural Society Campaign for School Gardening and the UK Space Agency. The schoolchildren are looking after and measuring the plants as they grow, and will be recording the results online in June.
