Proposed Housing Development

The outline planning application for the proposed development of 90 homes on land to the rear of Cottingham Hall (formerly Bury House) has been resubmitted by the applicant and has now been registered by Corby Borough Council - reference 06/00094/OUT.

What happens next?

The next step is for the Council to advertise the application on nearby lamp posts (orange notices) and in the Evening Telegraph newspaper. From the date the notices and advertisement appear, you'll have 21 days to submit your comments in writing to Gordon Smith, Planning Services, Corby Borough Council, Deene House, Post Office Square, Corby, Northants NN17 1GD. You can also submit comments online via www.corby.gov.uk, although at the time of writing the application has not been lodged on the Council's website.

Once any comments have been reviewed, the Council's planning officers will make a recommendation to either approve or reject the application. If they recommend approval, the application will then go to the Council's Development Control Committee for consideration (next available meeting 23 May). If the planning officers recommend rejection, it's possible that the application will not be referred to the Committee but will be rejected using the planning officers' 'delegated authority'. A final decision is expected by 15 June.

Cottingham Parish Council Planning Committee Meeting, Tue 25 April

Cottingham Parish Council is holding a Planning Committee Meeting on Tuesday 25 April starting at 7pm in the Village Hall Annexe to consider the above planning application.

Members of the public are invited to attend this meeting and share their views and there will also be the opportunity to view the plans and supporting documentation.

Land at top of Corby Road

Following refusal of the planning application for the installation of a mobile home on land at the top of Corby Road, Corby Borough Council has now been authorised to issue an enforcement notice for the removal of the tarmac that has been laid on the field.

The Northamptonshire County Council/Atkins partnership are also continuing to pursue the reinstatement of the grass verge between the current unauthorised access and the road.

Dog Fouling - Parish Council to Take Action

The issue of dog fouling on the recreation field is causing a great deal of concern amongst villagers with several complaints having been received. Dog fouling constitutes a significant health hazard, especially where young children are playing, and action needs to be taken.

Cottingham Parish Council is taking this issue very seriously and is currently investigating the enforcement in the village of the Clean Neighbourhoods and Environment Act 2005. This Act allows Parish Councils to ban dogs from certain areas and/or levy fixed penalty fines on dog owners who do not clean up after their pets. They also have the power to prosecute offenders through the magistrates court.
