Planning Application, Ashley Road, Middleton

The planning application for the stationing of caravans for three gypsy plots with utility/day rooms on a piece of land off Ashley Road has been **refused** by Corby Borough Council.

A new enforcement notice was issued by Corby Borough Council on 12 January for the removal of the caravan(s) and structure(s) on the site and the restoration of the land to a paddock.

This enforcement notice took effect on 16 February. However, we are advised that the applicants have recently submitted an **appeal** to the Government's Planning Inspectorate against the refusal of planning permission. The enforcement notice will therefore be placed in abeyance until the appeal has been heard.

Rural Police Update

From PCSO Pete Heyward

We have continued our 'street a week' campaign throughout all of the rural villages and have had some really positive feedback.

One of the main concerns in Cottingham and Middleton is street lighting, and we are working with the Council to overcome this problem. Please keep talking to us and

letting us know your problems and concerns so we can attempt to address these issues.

We have also carried out an operation to try and help reduce the levels of dog fouling in the villages. The PCSOs have been given bio-degradable dog litter bags to hand out to members of the public who are unequipped on their dog walks. So, if you are without a litterbag, ask Phil, Pete or Julie and they will have a chat and hand you a bag.

Across the county, we have had a handful of thefts in the early hours of the morning where people have left their vehicles unattended, with the engine running, to defrost the car. Please try not to leave your vehicles unattended as you never know who is looking. I would also ask you to be extra vigilant around your home security, as some areas have had problems with evening time burglaries.

We are still carrying out our usual speed enforcement and school parking patrols. So please keep to the speed limits and be mindful where you park.

News from the Parish Councils

Village Road Surface: Northants County Council has been made fully aware of the dangerous state of the village roads which is causing cars and horses to slip. Surface dressing is being carried out, but both Parish Councils are pushing for repairs to be carried out immediately, rather than having to wait until May for a new surface to be laid. We will keep you informed of progress.

Dog Fouling: Despite Middleton PC investing in three new dog litter bins, the problem of dog fouling persists, showing a complete disregard for our local environment and the wellbeing of other residents. The Parish Council now intends to adopt a zero tolerance approach and 'name and shame' policy. Village Lighting: Middleton PC is fighting Corby Borough Council's plans to remove the budget for village lighting improvements, on the grounds that good lighting is essential to public safety and security. 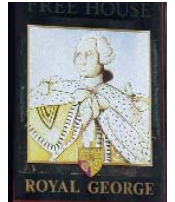
Hilda Bradshaw
