The new play area will


be officially opened by the Mayor of Corby at the Village Summer Fayre on Saturday 14 July (see back page for more details).

Planning and Development

Little Meadow, Corby Road

Cottingham Parish Council has engaged a solicitor to help fight the Government Planning Inspectorate's decision to grant temporary planning permission for the installation of a mobile home at Little Meadow on Corby Road.

The action is being funded by donations from villagers totalling £17,500. We will keep you informed as the case progresses.



Planning application for the development of six eco-friendly houses

An outline planning application has been submitted for six 3 and 4 bedroom environmentally friendly houses with a new access road on the field in front of the lime kiln to the south of Corby Road.

The houses would feature roof-mounted wind turbines, solar panels for hot water, ground source heating and photovoltaic cells.

Cottingham P C has opposed the application on the grounds that it is outside the village planning envelope within which new development is permitted as defined by the Corby Local Plan. The Parish Council has also expressed concerns about there being a history of flooding on the site, overcrowding of dwellings, poor visibility onto Corby Road for people and traffic leaving the site and overhead power lines impeding construction.

Cottingham Churchyard



The safety of memorials in churchyards is a current and ongoing concern that Cottingham Parochial Church Council (PCC) is obliged to address. The PCC has a legal liability for Cottingham churchyard generally but the ownership of a memorial belongs, in the first instance, to the person who purchased it and after that person's death the memorial is said to belong to the heirs at law of the person who is commemorated.

Cottingham PCC is keen to produce a register of families or persons whose ancestors are commemorated by memorials in the churchyard to assist in formulating a policy for future safe maintenance. Wild Flowers disappearing from the Dale





Over the past few months, large areas of native wild flowers, specifically meadow saxifrage (far left) and cowslips, have mysteriously disappeared from the Dale.

The likely explanation for this is that the plants have been uprooted (sorry – stolen) and we are aware that cowslips are being sold for profit at car boot sales.

It is against the law to remove wild plants without the landowner's consent (in this case, Cottingham Parish Council). The Dale is now being monitored closely and the issue has been reported to the Police. Branching Out! By Graham Ley

Don't ya just love trees?!
While strolling along the
Jurassic Way and into the
Dale, who can honestly say
they haven't scrambled
around for glossy conkers
from the huge horse chestnut
tree, or taken a running jump
at the rope swinging
temptingly from the
sycamore halfway up the



hill? I know I have! But it's only when you take a walk up to the top part of the Dale, as I did recently with Cottingham's Tree Warden **Jon Dixon**, and look back down at the stunning view towards the Welland Valley, that you realise how important the architectural shapes of our most beautiful native trees are to creating the character of the landscape in which we are lucky enough to live.

Jon is currently discussing an action plan with Cottingham Parish Council to maintain the trees in the Dale to ensure that this special place is preserved for us and for future generations. Trees, like everything else, have life spans dictated by nature and it is important that there is continuous renewal and management. The most urgent work is to tackle those trees which are diseased or weakened by age. One or two may have to be felled or pruned hard so that they do not pose a safety hazard to passers-by, but where possible Jon will leave the main trunk as a habitat for wildlife and as a striking natural monument. Cottingham Parish Council is also working on a replanting scheme for the Dale and is considering the dedication of trees which will allow villagers to buy and plant trees in memory of a loved one.

Of course, the landscape is not only about the Dale. We all need to share in the care of our trees, especially in the conservation areas in the two villages. Within these areas, it is a statutory requirement to seek permission from the Borough Council to fell or remove boughs from any tree with a trunk that has a diameter of 7cm or more. It's a straightforward and quick process – you can get the form from the Borough Council.

Crime Report

Only 10 crimes were reported in the villages during April and May. Again, this was mainly vandalism to parked vehicles with a couple of attempted break-ins to properties.



Northants Police are asking people to be on the lookout following a spate of lead thefts from church and school roofs across the county and also to watch out for any attempts to steal car registration plates.

Drugs Raid

You may be aware that two rented properties in Cottingham/Middleton were involved in a police drugs raid earlier this month. The raid netted £500,000 of cannabis, thought to be the largest ever drugs haul in the county.
