# Cottingham Villagers' Views Sought

Cottingham residents will soon be receiving questionnaires formally seeking their views on the future of their village. The questionnaires have been developed by the **Cottingham Parish Plan Steering Group** and are based on more than 200 comments from villagers at the 'Our Village, Our Future' day in January (pictured right).



Views are being sought from all villagers, young and old, on a range of important subjects including future

development, traffic safety, village facilities, leisure activities, environmental issues and communication.

Steering Group member Irene Beadsworth said: "The information we've gathered so far has given us a valuable insight into villagers' main areas of concern. But the questionnaire will enable us to confirm and quantify these views so there can be no doubt about the priorities and aspirations of Cottingham residents."

Once the questionnaires have been evaluated, the results will be used to formulate an action plan to be put forward for adoption by Cottingham Parish Council and subsequent integration into Corby Borough Council's planning and strategic framework.

"Villagers' views really do count and we **can** make a difference," continued Irene. "The questionnaire will only take around 20 minutes for each person to complete and we would urge everyone to spare a little of their time to take part in this important survey."

# **Cash Boost for Annexe Refurbishment**

The planned refurbishment of the Cottingham and Middleton Village Hall Annexe (pictured top left) has been given a £19,500 cash boost from Shanks First under the Landfill Tax Credit Scheme. This is where landfill operators can opt to pay a proportion of their landfill tax to charities such as Shanks First who use the money to fund community projects up and down the country.

The award from Shanks First means that the refurbishment project is now just £15,000 short of its £40,000 target. The project, being run by the Village Hall Management Committee (VHMC), will see the Annexe refurbished to include a bigger main hall, a small meeting room, kitchen facilities and a disabled toilet.

# New Site for BMX Track and Youth Shelter

A Working Group has been formed to take forward plans for the proposed temporary BMX track on the Recreation Field. The Working Group is proposing to re-site the planned 50 metre x 20 metre track on Parish Council land on the east side of the Recreation Field near the old grandstand, a site that has already been proposed for the location of the permanent track if the temporary scheme proves successful.

Dave Saunders from the BMX Track Working Group said: "We felt that the original site on the Village Acre near Mill Road might not be suitable for safety reasons and could possibly be prone to vandalism. The new proposed location will be highly visible, making it safer for the young people using the track."

It's proposed that the temporary track will also incorporate a new Youth Shelter, constructed from compressed fire and water resistant straw bales. The temporary track will be evaluated over a 12 month period but will still need to go through consultations with residents, the Parish Council and Corby Borough Council before the trial can begin.

The working group is being assisted by Northants ACRE and support has also been received from Weldon Plant in Corby who have agreed to donate top soil for the temporary track. For more information, contact Camilla Cobb at ACRE on 01604 825889, email camilla.cobb@northants acre.org.uk

# **Cash Available for Rural Projects**

A rural development initiative has kicked off to boost the Rockingham Forest, of which Cottingham is part. Funded by the European Community LEADER+ Programme and DEFRA, the Rockingham Forest Rural Revival (RRR) Programme provides support, guidance and cash for communities to undertake their own projects. Up to 70 per cent of funding can be provided for approved projects which must make the best use of natural and cultural resources, and benefit (among others) the target groups of the under 30s, women and rural workers/businesses.

# **Cottingham: Road Safety Action**

Road safety in Cottingham was given renewed focus recently when Parish Councillor Dave Sims showed Northants County Council traffic engineers around the village to highlight areas of concern.

Said Dave "We are now liaising with the County Council to get the 30 mph signs on Rockingham Road, Corby Road and Bringhurst Road moved further out to slow vehicles down before they enter the village. We're also investigating flashing 'slow down' signs, changing priorities at 'The Cross' and at the junction of Corby Road/Millfield Avenue, and a new zebra crossing outside the Hunting Lodge."

All these initiatives will rely on securing funding but Dave is confident that data gathered as part of the Community Speedwatch initiative will help to strengthen the village's case. The Speedwatch initiative will see hand-held speed guns being operated in the village by locally trained residents in either August or October this year.


