Be on your guard

Four crimes have been reported in the villages from 20 April to 7 June, including graffiti



on a wall at the top of Corby Road, theft from a driveway in Stonepit Drive and break-in to non-domestic premises on High Street. Also, a driver who left his engine running while delivering a package in Berryfield Road has had his vehicle stolen. A similar incident occurred in Darescroft earlier in the year and we would urge residents to be vigilant. Always lock your car, and never leave your keys in the ignition if you

are leaving your car unattended - even for a minute - as this is all it takes for an opportunistic criminal to take advantage.

The local police have also issued a warning to be on your guard against a group of salesmen who have been seen in the area recently selling household goods door-to-door. Unfortunately, this group has been linked with burglaries in the areas they visit. To protect yourself and your home, if a salesman knocks on your door ask to see their ID and their Peddler's Certificate, issued by the local council. If you are in any way suspicious, contact the local Police straight away on their new number **03000 111222** (or **999** for emergencies) and, if you see a vehicle, take down the registration number.
