Village bus services

The RF1 (Corby to Oakham) bus service has been saved and will keep running for at least the next five years, following a change of heart by operator Centrebus which had initially wanted to pull out. The new contract starts on 24 September and will include an additional stop at Corby Rail Station.

Meanwhile, a petition has been launched by Corby's Labour Party representative Beth Miller to save the No.67 bus service (Gretton to Market Harborough), which stopped running on 25 May after Northants County Council withdrew their subsidy. You can sign the petition at www.38degrees.org (search for 'buses Northamptonshire'). Discussions are also underway with Corby and Kettering councils regarding potentially funding the service.

In the meantime, if you need transport to get into Harborough, call the Village Store on 770097 and they'll see if they can find someone to give you a lift.
