Our green spaces need friends!

From George West-Robinson, Chair, Cottingham Parish Council



For me, one of the most inspiring aspects of helping to create Cottingham's Neighbourhood Plan was learning about our green spaces and what we can do to preserve, safeguard and improve them.

You'll be familiar with The Dale, the recreation field and the churchyard, but there are also other smaller areas – like the wide verge at Glover Court and the recently cleared area between the church and The Dale, along with pockets of green between roads, behind garages etc – that all just need that little bit of help to realise their aesthetic and biodiverse potential.

We feel that all our green spaces, large and small, could be greatly enhanced if we could manage, study and care for them in a holistic, strategic way. For example, much is often said of the importance of 'wildlife corridors', but in truth we don't really have a handle on where these are locally and what issues and threats they face.

As a first step, we're therefore looking to set up a 'Friends of Green Spaces' working group (or FROGS maybe?). We'll be drawing on villagers' significant knowledge and expertise, including from members of the now diminished 'Friends of the Dale' which has done so much to secure and safeguard that space over many years. We are also hugely encouraged to have some young villagers who show passion and determination to prevent deterioration (e.g. of verges), promote biodiversity, enhance pollinator populations and connect with nature.

We're just looking to gain interest at this stage with a view to holding a get together sometime in October. And remember, our green spaces really do need friends – here's your chance to be one of them!

Cottingham Neighbourhood Plan

Villagers now have their final chance to comment on the Cottingham Neighbourhood Plan, which has been prepared by Cottingham Parish Council with the help of the community and submitted to North Northamptonshire Council for publication.

Consultation on the Plan runs from Friday 27 August to 5pm on Friday 8 October 2021.

The Plan sets out detailed local planning policies to help shape and guide development within the designated neighbourhood plan area for Cottingham, which covers the whole of Cottingham Parish.

Reporting aggressive and noisy dogs

There have been multiple reports regarding harassment of walkers, cyclists, horse riders and livestock by aggressive, loose dogs at Oakley Park, including a recent dog attack on a child and a Police Officer. Please continue to report any incidents you witness as follows.

- Barking, noise, dogs escaping from the site and obstructing traffic but without any aggressive behaviour – report to Kerry Walke, North Northants Council Environmental Health, tel 01536 464069, email envhealth.cbc@northnorthants.gov.uk
- If a dog is aggressive and bites, attempts to bite or puts a person in fear of being bitten, report this to the **Police** using the 101 number (999 if an emergency). Please take a photo of the dog if you can do so at no personal risk. The Police will ask you to provide a formal statement.

Please also send details of any new reports, and any already made, to Middleton RAG at middletonrag@gmail.com, so they can compile a comprehensive record of incidents.

The Mill Community Hub

An update from Acting Joint Chairs George West-Robinson and Sarah Brant



The easing of restrictions and early signs of COTTINGHAM & MIDDLETON economic recovery are giving us hope and impetus to crank up Mill related activities,

both in terms of fundraising and on the practical construction front. Even though it'll take a while yet for the brakes to come off various capital award and grant bodies, our amazing supporters in the community have kept funds coming in.

We thank and salute everyone whose incredible efforts and ingenuity has kept the bank balance growing. Since the last newsletter, Kate Cross has donated £230 from a clothes sale, £156 of coppers have been collected from jars around the villages and Amazon Smile earned us £45. Including £94 of interest, the Mill's funds now stand at almost £44,000. Bear in mind that some elements of the project such as the archaeological and tree surveys have been paid for.

We are now in a position to focus on the gateway and entrance element of the construction plan and, once that's done, we will consider the best options for the car park. In that regard, we are looking to move away from traditional methods and materials by exploring green solutions that don't require the smothering of large areas in tarmac. As the costs of building materials have spiralled over the last 18 months, and with availability badly affected, we'll also be looking into alternative. cost-effective, efficient materials and construction methods. This could, for example, move us from a 'bricks and mortar' to a modular approach.



Support for Afghan refugees

Two villagers, Nicola Tyldesley in Cottingham and Leigh Morrell in Middleton, are organising collections for the refugees arriving in our region from Afghanistan.

Leigh is collecting for a Corby-based project co-ordinated by Corby Councillor Martin Reuby and local volunteers, and for 'The Shack' food project in Kettering.

She is looking for non-perishable food items, quality second hand clothing, new pants and socks, toiletries, baby items (nappies, wipes,

Nicola has used the almost £1,000 donated so far to buy pants, socks, tracksuit bottoms, T shirts, baby milk and nappies. The items have been donated to the 'Care to Feed' and 'City of Sanctuary' charities in Leicester and also to the Shack food project.

"These people are arriving with nothing," said Nicola. "They are terrified and lost, and many have left loved ones behind who they may never see again. I am just so grateful to all the people who have donated and offered their time. It's been humbling to see people rallying to help - I've even had two little children raising money by drawing pictures and selling them to family members. Thank you all so much."
