Carolynn wins national gold teaching award



Carolynn Southcombe, Administrator at Cottingham CofE Primary School, made national TV last Friday, when she appeared on the BBC's 'One Show' receiving a coveted national teaching award from the show's presenter, Alex Jones.

Alex had arrived at the school in disguise as a baker delivering an urgently needed cake. Unbeknown to Carolynn, her current and former colleagues, pupils and family had gathered in the assembly hall to surprise her with the award.

Carolynn has won the Gold Award in the Unsung Hero category of the prestigious Pearson National Teaching Awards, which recognise the nation's most inspirational educators.

Carolynn organises student enrichment trips, arranges weekly school yoga sessions, leads the Magnificent Minds group – working with children who then promote wellbeing and healthy living to other students – and the 'Love to Lunch' group, where family members are invited into school to eat with the children and enjoy sharing special time together. She has also raised thousands of pounds for the school and other charities through sponsored walks.

"I was overwhelmed to have been nominated in the first instance," said Carolynn. "Winning the gold is incredible and also a testament to Cottingham CofE Primary School, which really is an amazing place to work.

"I want to thank Mr Scott, our headteacher, for nominating me and letting me be me, leading the children in various activities to help get that important message across about looking after their mental health and wellbeing. I want to thank the children who really make our school the amazing place it is, and all the staff and school community for their support."



The Church Committee would also love for St Mary Magdalene to be used for more events.


Being part of this Fundraising Friends group would not presume any wider church commitment or attendance, but your help and ideas could help to preserve this wonderful piece of our village heritage.

The Boundary Commission is reviewing Parliamentary constituencies to rebalance the number of electors in each, and is proposing to move Cottingham and Middleton from the current 'Corby and East Northamptonshire' Constituency, to Kettering Constituency. Contact the **Defra helpline** on **03459 33 55 77** if you find one or more dead birds of prey, three or more dead gulls or wild waterfowl, or five or more dead birds of any species.

Cost of living support

There are a number of initiatives available to help with the rising cost of living, especially if you're on a low income or are receiving benefits or pension credits. This includes discounts and free meals from leading supermarkets, up to 50% off your Severn Trent water bill, a free Company Shop card if you're on means tested benefits, and financial help from North Northants Council's Household Support Fund. Pat and Don Licquorish celebrate Diamond Anniversary



Congratulations to Pat and Don Licquorish who celebrated their Diamond (60th) Wedding Anniversary in August.

The couple have lived in the village all their lives and were married at St Mary Magdalene Church on a hot summer's day in 1962, holding their reception at the Jubilee Hall, which was then located on Ashley Road in Middleton.

Don was born in Chamberlain's Yard, just off Church Street, and was part of a large family. His father Thomas Albert had nine siblings and his grandfather Charles William was part of the workforce that built the Welland Viaduct in Harringworth. After leaving school, he worked at the blast furnaces in the Corby steelworks and, when the works closed in 1980, worked as a machine operator until retiring in 2003.

Pat was born at Brickfield House on Rockingham Road, where ancestors of both Don and Pat had lived previously. Pat worked as a bookkeeper for EW Barlow and Sons (Agricultural Engineers) in Rockingham before taking on the role of caretaker (site supervisor) at Cottingham CofE Primary School in 1977, where she remained until 2003.

After their marriage, Don and Pat purchased a modest

sized plot of land adjacent to Corby Road, at the top of the path down to Water Lane, for £800! Here, Don, together with other members of the family, built their first home – the bungalow which is the first property on the left when entering the village from Corby, and has since undergone a lot of changes. In 2015, when the size of the garden and the upkeep of the property became too unwieldy, they moved from Water Lane to a bungalow on Stonepit Drive.

Pat and Don were among the couples who would have been the last to receive a congratulations card from Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II before her passing, which makes it even more special for them. Congratulations Don and Pat!
