The heavens opened on 15 July, the day of the Village Fete, but undeterred, the organisers moved everything inside into the Village Hall Annex and School Hall, and more than 500 people braved the elements to attend and support the event.

Live entertainment was provided by the Welland Valley Voice Choir, Oh Brother! and Soundpost, and visitors enjoyed a range of stalls including food and drink, plants, home made crafts and preserves, a tombola and raffle which, together with the money raised from advertising in the Fete programme, netted £4,762 for The Mill Community Hub Project.

The ever popular tea and cake stall, run by volunteers from St Mary Magdalene Church, raised £470 towards church funds, and Cottingham Primary School PTFA provided games and entertainment for youngsters, raising £800 towards school funds.

This totals £6,032, which is a tremendous achievement, and the organisers would like to thank everyone for supporting the event, and the volunteers for their contributions and manning the stalls.




Carolynn completes 100 mile walking challenge

Cottingham C of E Primary School bursar Carolynn Southcombe walked 100 miles over the Summer to raise \pounds 12,000 for the school and local children's mental health charity Service Six.

Carolynn presented Service Six CEO Emma Campion and her colleague Pep Finn with a cheque for £560 at a special assembly at the end of last term.

"We rely on donations and this one is massive for us," said Emma. "It will really help the young people we work with. We plan to use the money to buy arts and craft resources, games and toys, for the children and young people who come to our youth groups. Mobile Flu Jab Clinic, 2 October

Thursfields Pharmacy are offering a mobile flu jab clinic at 22 Bancroft Road, Cottingham on 2 October, from 9.30am to 12.30pm, and from 5.30pm to 7pm.

The jab is free for anyone aged 65 and over, or if you are pregnant, a carer or have a disability or chronic long-term

condition. For anyone aged 50 to 64 in good health, the flu jab costs £14.99, which is now standard across England. The mobile clinic has a card machine to take payments, and card payments are preferred please. However, if you want to pay by cash, please let Carol know (contact details below), so the clinic can make sure they have sufficient change.

No appointment is needed, but if you're planning to go along for the jab, please text or WhatsApp **Carol** on **07711 545470**, so she can get an idea of numbers. Please also complete and take along the flu vaccination record form that you can get from the village website, the Village Store and Café, or from Carol directly.

She now has DBS certification, and over the next year we hope to get our junior group 'Tadpoles' involved in more projects around the village, particularly in developing areas for pollinating insects and corridors for wildlife.

FroGS has several other plans and projects in the pipeline and is now actively linking with other like-minded organisations to share ideas, access

Mill update from the Board of Trustees

The Mill Community Hub Project has an overall remit to ensure the provision of future-proofed, sustainable community facilities for the villagers of Cottingham and Middleton.

Our long-term objective is the construction of a new community facility 'The Mill' on a piece of land known as the 'Village Acre', which is located next to the recreation field, down past the school as you head towards Bringhurst on Mill Road.

However, due to escalating construction costs and changes in funding criteria for new builds, it could be some years before this objective can be fully realised. And so the Mill Trustees have been considering how, in the interim, we can best ensure villagers have ongoing access to suitable community facilities where we can meet, gather and share experiences.

After much thought, we are agreed that our immediate focus needs to include maintaining and enhancing our existing village facilities and, under the overall umbrella of 'The Mill Community Hub Project', we are now actively working with our friends on the Village Hall Management Committee (VHMC) to make sure the current Village Hall Annex remains a viable facility for community use in the short to medium term. This includes making improvements to the premises and increasing bookings to maximise income.

We are also progressing with building the new car park that's included in the plans for the proposed new Mill Hub. Located on the Village Acre, this will have multiple benefits such as providing parking at school drop-off and pick-up times, parking for events and meetings at The Annex, and enabling greater use of the recreation field for sports.

At the Village Fete, we were pleased to be able to update villagers on our plans for the new car park and the Mill Project generally, which will include research to better understand what's needed from the existing facility and requirements for the new building. There was a steady flow of visitors eager to learn more and volunteer their support.
