Boundary changes

The proposed changes to local electoral ward boundaries have been ratified. In the next local council elections, Cottingham and Middleton will be part of an enlarged Desborough Ward, along with Sutton Basset, Weston-by-Welland, Wilbarston, Stoke Albany, Ashley, Dingley and the town of Desborough. The current Corby Rural Ward will cease to exist.

The parliamentary constituencies for the villages will also change at the next General Election. We will move from Corby to the Kettering Constituency, where the current MP is Philip Hollobone (Conservative).

Awareness Day

Peasdale Hill planning update

The planning appeal hearing for Peasdale Hill held in Corby on 7–8 November was not fully completed due to the amount of evidence the Inspector had to go through.

RAG representatives attended and contributed on both days through their planning advisor Philip Hughes, and NNC attended with their legal counsel and expert witnesses on highways, ecology, landscape, need and archaeology. Tom Pursglove MP had requested an opportunity to present at the hearing, too, but time constraints did not allow for this, so he submitted a written statement instead, which was accepted by the Inspector.

In Memory...

⁻ Jim Wratten, 1924–2023

Jim Wratten sadly passed away on 30 August aged 98 at Polebrook Nursing Home.

Jim moved to Cottingham from London in 1971 to work as Dispatch Manager at Celebration Arts in Corby, where he eventually became Company Director. Jim embraced village life and served on the

Parish Council for some years, was a regular church attendee and bell ringer and organised a number of litter picks, rewarding youngsters on the day with chocolates.

He lived with his first wife Pat in Bury Close before she sadly passed away in 1979, and married his second wife Mabel, who he had worked alongside at Celebration Arts, in 1992. After several happy years in Bury Close, they moved to Brigstock. Jim is survived by Mabel (now 103!), her daughter Jan and son-in-law Del, who live in Middleton. They describe Jim as an 'Old School Gent' – honest, hardworking, and a man who would do anything for anyone. Jim returned to Cottingham for his send off at St Mary Magdalene Church on 26 September.

John Andrew Freestone, 1934–2023



John and Mary Freestone moved to Bury House (Cottingham Hall) after their marriage in 1960, where John set about improving the house, as it was in a bad state of repair and had been left for many years, first adding five flats, then converting the pig pens and hayloft into the Hunting Lodge restaurant. A banqueting hall was then built from the broiler houses. John gave part of the land to the council to improve the road to Middleton, smoothing out what was a very bad blind corner. Today, a tree stands on the island that was planted by John and Mary all those years ago.

On the rest of the paddock land, John, with the help of sub-contractors, built the bungalows and created Bury Close. Some villagers still remember the youth club that John ran, and the annual garden fetes held at the house.

John and Mary had Caroline, Charles and Andrew, but Andrew sadly died at 12 days old. In the late 1970s, John moved away to invest in hotels in the north, returning to live in Northamptonshire years later. He loved coming back to the villages and always had great stories to tell about his days running the house and the Hunting Lodge. John's children were with him when he passed away in Banbury Hospital after a short battle with cancer. He was 88 years old.

Mill update from the Board of Trustees

Phase 1 of the Mill Community Hub car park is now complete. During October half term, the trees and bushes were removed and new permanent fencing was erected around the school boundary. Temporary fencing lines the edge of the road in preparation for Phase 2. The plans are currently with NNC and the Highways Agency, and Phase 2 is planned for the Spring.



The new car park will have multiple benefits such as providing parking at school drop-off and pick-up times, parking for events and meetings at The Annex, and enabling greater use of the recreation field for sports.


