The next newsletter will be the Christmas issue and it'll be out at the start of December. If you're planning any festive events, please let me have details as soon as possible and by 23 November at the latest.



Cottingham has been named medium-sized Village of the Year in the 2012 Northamptonshire Best Village Competition, winning a certificate, a trophy and £75 for the Parish Council.

The judges visited the village in May, where they met a group of villagers at the Village Store for a coffee and chat. Villagers included organiser Ann Davison and Cottingham Parish

Councillor Owen Davison (pictured), Cottingham Parish Councillor Irene Beadsworth and Parish Clerk Peter Taylor, Jon and Claire Dixon with their daughter Anna, Angela Preston-Jones, David and Kirsty Swallow. Together, they talked enthusiastically about how the new shop was set up, village activities and events, the new youth club and what it's like to live here. The judges were also taken to see The Dale and the village school, so they could see for themselves more of what the village has to offer.

We have had a few random crimes committed which have possibly coincided with visits to the '22 foot' on the River Welland. If any residents experience anti-social behaviour from groups passing through the villages, please call the Police on 101 so that we can either monitor he situation or prevent further incidents from happening.

There is a myth from some scrap metal collectors that scrap prices have fallen and they no longer believe it is profitable to collect scrap. So, with this in mind, some are choosing to door knock and ask residents for work. Please be vigilant and, if you experience this, let me know, or if

they become persistent, please call 101.

We have also had an incident reported of two suspicious males taking photos in the Cannam Close Middleton Cold Calling Zone. Reports are they were taking photos of properties. These males had disappeared by the time Police had arrived so the reasons are still unknown. Again please be vigilant.

Cottingham Parish Council News from Pete Bowman, Chairman

Grass cutting. We've had a lot of discussion and comments about the quality of grass cutting in Cottingham since we changed contractor earlier this year. In the light of some teething troubles at the beginning of the season, the contractor assured us that there would be a noticeable improvement and we are now monitoring each cut carefully. The current contractor will continue to the end of the cutting season – which will be around the end of October – and the Parish Council will be reviewing the standard of cutting shortly after then.

Little Meadow. As you may be aware, the temporary planning permission for Little Meadow expired on 20 February and a new application for a permanent site was submitted to Corby Borough Council. The new application is still being considered by the Borough Council, which is waiting for the result of the Ashley Road inquiry before making a decision on the Little Meadow application. In the meantime, the Borough Council's guidance to us is that they '...would not normally pursue action against unauthorised development in circumstances where no decision has been made on the acceptability of an application.'

Both issues will be discussed at our next Parish Council meeting on Wed 3 October, 7.30pm at the Village Hall Annex. Everyone is welcome to come along and air their views.

Grass cutting. The Parish Council is in the process of changing its contractor for this work and hopes to bring an improvement in the quality and timeliness of cutting in the future.

Telephone kiosk. The BT equipment has now been removed from the Middleton kiosk, which was adopted by the parish for £1. Repainting and refurbishment will start soon. News from Cottingham School from Emma Tayler, Head Teacher

Cottingham Primary School is delighted to announce that it was removed from Special Measures in July this year. The school was placed in this category in 2010 and since then has worked with OfSTED to secure the necessary improvements in the school.

Martin Cragg, the HMI Inspector who has overseen these improvements, has worked closely with the school since his first visit to ensure that the necessary changes were put in place. Mr Cragg spoke positively about the strong team work, the positive Christian ethos and the commitment of all the staff in rising to the challenges faced. In his report he stated: "The head teacher has brought about significant change and improvement, setting a clear vision and high expectations for the school. The school has successfully tackled the issues from its last inspection, taking effective action to manage performance, improve teaching and pupils' achievement. It has good capacity to improve further."

This was a fantastic end to our extremely successful 2011 - 2012 year which included our first victory at the Welland Valley sports athletics event for 10 years and the most successful end of Key Stage 2 SATs results for the last few years. These results put us well above the national average compared to other schools.

We are looking forward to continuing to build on all these successes as we begin the new academic year.
