The Red Lion in Middleton has re-opened as a bar and restaurant offering tapas along with succulent meats grilled over coals and wood on an Argentinian style 'Asado' grill. They offer a

special Sunday lunch menu and there's a bar if you just fancy popping in for a drink. The Red Lion has undergone a complete refit and is run by father and son team Paul and Michael Morgan. Paul, who previously owned and ran a 600-seater restaurant in Derby, has lived in Middleton for the past six years. Cottingham C of E Primary School's Year 5/6 tag rugby team has beaten off stiff competition to be named Corby and District Champions in the 'Road to Twickenham Small Schools Rugby Championship'.

Ed Dee, whose daughter Imogen is part of the winning team, said: "We were up against schools much larger than ours so this is a real achievement. The children looked very comfortable with each other and showed great team work. We are all really proud of them."

The team has been practising rugby skills in their PE lessons with Jack Hubbard, a PE specialist who's been coaching at Cottingham for over a year. As well as the rugby triumph, Cottingham C of E Primary School has won the local heats of the 7-a side Small Schools Football Competition and is representing Corby in the Northants regional final this year. Proposed development - rear of Cottingham Hall

Here is a quick update from Cottingham and Middleton Parish Councils. Please see the village website for more details and latest news.

- Peter Brett Associates (PBA) have confirmed that their client for this proposed development is Mr W Kiff, formerly of Cottingham Hall. However, as yet, no planning application has been submitted.
- The main planning argument for approval of this development would seem to be that Corby Borough Council (CBC) is not able to demonstrate a five year supply of deliverable housing land, which it is now required to do under national planning policy. The targets that this five year supply is measured against are based on the East Midlands Regional Plan that was revoked in April 2013.

An Interim Housing Statement (IHS) has now been produced, containing revised housing targets. A draft report, which will go to CBC's Local Plan Committee on 5 March, indicates that CBC can demonstrate a five year supply of deliverable housing land against these new targets. On 9 January, the North Northants Joint Planning Unit agreed that the IHS should be used as a benchmark to assess the supply of deliverable housing land, until the review of the Core Strategy has been completed. However, the weight that can be applied to the IHS remains to be tested and is being challenged by developers.

 In October 2013, Mr Kiff submitted a request for a screening opinion under the Town and Country planning (EIA) Regulations 2011. We understand that this request is asking CBC to assess whether or not a Strategic Environmental Assessment Report (SEA) is required for this development. This is still pending consideration.

Dog fouling increases - villagers urged to report offenders

There has been an increase in dog fouling over the past few months, particularly on the green bank and steps opposite the shop and on the pavements at the bottom of Corby Road and Rockingham Road.

Corby Borough Council's Environmental Services team have been informed and they are stepping up action to address this problem. They are asking villagers to report any incidences of dog fouling, giving as much information as possible including date, time, location, description of the dog and its owner, plus a photograph (optional).

The Council can issue £50 fixed penalty fines if there is enough evidence and will prosecute for non-payment. Please keep your eyes peeled and, if you know who is responsible but have not witnessed an incident directly, let Environmental Services have their name and address so a warning letter can be issued. And, if you are one of the culprits, please clean up after your dog. Villagers and Environmental Services are on the lookout, so a hefty fine could be heading your way.


