Thanks to all the volunteers who turned out for the recent village litter



Cottingham School in footy triumph



Cottingham School's football team has beaten off stiff competition to become Northamptonshire champions in the English FA Small Schools Tournament.

The team won two games, drew three and, with the defence conceding only two goals and the strikers Max MacAuley, Max Fletcher and Luke Kearns scoring 12 goals between them, were the highest scoring team in the tournament.

Thanks goes to long term manager Dave Payne and team coach Al Cousins for all the time and effort they have put into training and matches. Al, who is also director of the team's sponsors Low Loaders Europe, said: "The competition was tough but the boys did amazingly well, putting all their training into practice. We are all over the moon!"

Winning the cup is a tremendous achievement and builds on the school's triumph in the Welland Valley Athletics Championships last year. Cottingham School is rapidly gaining a reputation as a sporting force in Northamptonshire. The team is now preparing for the Regional Finals to be held at Nottingham University this month.

Repairs to wall on Corby Road

Repairs to the wall behind the bus shelter on Corby Road were completed in December last year. Parish councillors – especially Cllr Geof Hudson, who oversaw the project – worked hard to make sure that the repairs were carried out guickly, safely and efficiently.

Cottingham Parish Council felt that the work had to be undertaken immediately for a number of health and safety reasons to help protect the two properties behind the wall and restore the Royal George's rear emergency exit in time for the busy Christmas period.

These initial works, costing around £10,000, have been paid for by the Parish Council but they are still looking into ownership issues to see whether any of these costs can be clawed back. The Parish Council would like to thank Northants County Councillor Stan Heggs for his very generous contribution of £1,440 from his Empowering Councillors and Communities Fund to help fund the works. This is Cllr Heggs' second donation in as many months – the first being his donation of £1,200 to renovate the War Memorial – and we are all very grateful for his help.
