The newly refurbished Village Hall Annex was officially opened on 30 June by Cottingham's Roy Harrison. Roy has lived in Cottingham for all his 81 years and was born in the old cottages opposite 'The Nook' on Corby Road. He was also one of the original trustees for the Village Hall charity.

Little Meadow, Corby Road

Two appeals have been lodged with the Government's Planning Inspectorate in respect of the land known as 'Little Meadow' at the top of Corby Road, as follows:

Appeal reference APP/U2805/A/06/2016152/NWF (Case Officer, Mr D Packer) Appeal against the refusal of planning permission for the installation of a mobile home (deadline for comments was 17 July 2006).

Appeal reference APP/U2805/C/06/2017666 (Case Officer, Mrs Shelley Hicks) Appeal against the enforcement notice to remove tarmac and reinstate the land to pasture (deadline for comments was 9 August 2006).

For both appeals, Corby Borough Council has sent written representations to the Inspectorate along with copies of all letters of support or objection that they received about the planning application whilst considering it.

St Mary Magdalene 'Fit for the Future' Appeal 2006




St Mary Magdalene has launched an appeal to raise the remaining £15,000 towards a £72,000 restoration to make the church building secure and fit for the future. The other £57,000 has been raised over the years through events, charity donations and an English Heritage grant.

The church, which has stood in the village since the 13th Century, last underwent a major restoration in 1880. This last restoration cost £2,500 and included the removal of the galleries within the church, new pews, windows and steps, and the donation and installation of the church's first ever organ. Before this, the singing had been led by a harmonium.

Kicking off in September, the church is now looking to carry out repairs to the tower and spire along with a programme of internal restoration. Plans have been drawn up and are on permanent display in the church. If you'd like to make a donation or sponsor a specific item, please contact **Mark Colby** on **770178**.

Bob and Julie of Welland View Road are acting as a collection point for fruit and vegetable boxes from Woodlands Organic Farm near Boston, Lincolnshire. The boxes cost from just £6 and you can also order organic eggs, turkey, beef and lamb.

Middleton Traffic Calming

Middleton Parish Council has given approval for a sub-committee to prepare a detailed proposal for chicane type traffic calming at two locations on Main Street - one near the bus stop outside Wantage Mews and the other adjacent to the post box/seat near 34 Main Street.

The proposal will be submitted to Northants County Council for approval. If successful, the required funding of approximately £12,000 will be sought from any available source.

Well if you've yet to reach your second birthday you might well prefer the latter, but the former is also on offer for those bringing their babies, toddlers and pre-

school children to Messy Moos on Wednesdays at the Village Hall Annex!

On the day I visited, organisers Tasja Whitehead, Jo Green and Kim Miller had the kids throwing themselves into a wonderful variety of creative (and messy) activities such as potato stamping, making paper JCBs with moving parts, sand play and stencils. Jo and Kim both have nursery experience and Kim is a qualified nanny. They started the group mainly to amoose (sorry) their own and their friends' children, but it has proved justifiably popular for many others.

The group meets from 1.45pm to 3.15pm during school terms, conveniently timed for those collecting children from Cottingham School. Obituary: Rosa Lenton



Mrs Rosa Lenton of Berryfield Road sadly passed away in July at the grand old age of 90.

Rosa was born in Blatherwycke and came to Cottingham in 1947 with her husband Bill. Quite a character, Rosa took easily to village life, joining the potato picking teams and working at the local shoe factory for a time. She was always supportive of village events and activities, especially the local history and gardening societies, and she will be remembered as a keen and talented gardener.

Rosa's son 'Butch' was a well known sight in the village running the mobile shop and greengrocer's service for many years. Her daughter Margaret sadly died of multiple sclerosis a couple of years ago and residents in Berryfield Road have collected £110 for the MS Society in Rosa's memory.

Rosa now rests in Cottingham churchyard alongside her husband. Her parents, both of whom lived to over 100 years of age, are also buried in the churchyard.
