Change to Village Boundary

Cottingham Parish Council, Extraordinary Meeting 11 August, 7.30pm, Village Hall Annexe

You are invited to attend the above meeting which is being held to discuss a proposed change to the boundary between Cottingham and Middleton.

The current boundary cuts across the Eastern edge of the new Glover Court housing development (off Main Street), placing 1.5 of the 27 dwellings in Cottingham, the remainder being in Middleton. It also cuts through an area of open space at the entrance to the site.


For administrative purposes, Middleton Parish Council has proposed that the boundary be moved to bring all the houses, the open space (and the responsibility for maintaining this space, eg. grass cutting) into Middleton.

As a separate issue, you may have heard that the developers of Glover Court, Faircloughs, are providing £119,500 to Corby Borough Council for community facilities in the two villages under what is known as a 'Section 106 Agreement'.

From this money, it has been agreed that Middleton will receive £40,000 towards a new meeting room, to be built on the open space at the entrance to Glover Court. This meeting room will be available for use by both villages. £60,000 will be retained for maintenance of the Glover Court site and Cottingham will receive £19,500 to upgrade facilities on the recreation ground next to the school.

The proposed boundary change will have absolutely no impact on the split of the funding.

The plan below shows the existing boundary, the proposed new boundary and the two options for the location of the proposed village hall.

Parish Plans

Cottingham

More than 60 villagers attended a meeting last month (July 1) to begin the process of producing a parish plan for Cottingham.

Parish plans are a Countryside Agency initiative which aim to encourage local communities to shape the future of their villages. A steering group of 12 villagers has now been formed to take things forward for Cottingham. The parish council is being represented by Phil Dyne and the group is being supported by Carolyn Turner from Northants ACRE. Carolyn is also investigating funding for production of the plan.

The steering group has set up a number of sub groups to focus on the key areas raised at the initial meeting, as follows:
