After a long fundraising campaign which began back in April 2004, repairs to the steeple and roof of St Mary Magdalene are now underway.

The campaign has raised over £80,000 towards the high level repairs needed to keep the Church watertight and preserved for future generations. The congregation and friends of the Church have raised £30,000 with significant contributions received from English Heritage and other historic church preservation trusts and foundations.
