

Immie's write on!

Cottingham's Imogen Owen made national TV in March when she was invited on to Channel 4's Sunday Brunch to demonstrate her modern calligraphy skills and talk about her new book.

"I started teaching myself calligraphy back in 2013 as a way to chill out from work," says Immie. "But when I posted pics of my work on Instagram, I quickly got asked if I would teach workshops on my style of calligraphy, and so partnered with online stationery store Quill who hosted my classes in London. Having taught more than 1,000 people in my first year, I was then contacted by a few different publishers and asked if I'd write a book on it, which was pretty awesome!"



Immie's book '*Modern Calligraphy Workshop by Imogen Owen*' is doing really well and, after her TV appearance, was in the top 70 best selling books on Amazon.

Immie also runs a stationery brand from her studio in Church Street, designing greetings cards and luxury stationery printed on vintage letterpress printing presses. Remembering World War I



As part of their World War I commemorations, Corby Council has been raising a First World War Centenary Flag outside The Cube on the 100th anniversary of the death of any of the borough's servicemen, where it is flown all day.

A roll of honour with information on each of the villages' soldiers who gave their lives during the War is now available on www.corby.gov.uk.

Two sons lost

The most recent Cottingham soldier commemorated by the Borough Council was 19 year old **Ernest Crane** (pictured above left), who was killed in action on 4 March 1917 at the Battle of the Somme.

His brother **George** (pictured above right) had been killed in the Somme just nine months earlier (30 July 1916), aged 20.

Both boys were born in Liverpool and before the War lived in Rockingham Road with their father William.

On 4 June 1917, 32 year old **James Simpson** lost his life in the Arras Offensive on the Somme.

James, a farm labourer, had lived on Mill Road with his father Francis, a market gardener, mother Annie and siblings.

James served in the Northamptonshire Regiment's 6th Battalion that had been led by **Colonel George Ripley** of Bury House, Cottingham (pictured right) until he died on 16 October 1916 from wounds sustained at Thiepval.

Former Cottingham resident Colin Dexter, author of the Inspector Morse novels, passed away in March.

Simon Medwell remembers Colin. "He lived for a while in Bury Close, Cottingham, while he was teaching Greek and Latin at Corby Grammar School, now the site of Tresham College. He also played hockey for Corby Hockey Club.

"One of the characters in his novels, Max the pathologist, was based on a friend who worked at what is now the Lakeside Surgery. The giveaway connection was the standard bow tie which both men wore."
