

Rumoured Developments

There have been lots of rumours circulating recently regarding possible developments on land in and around the villages.

Cottingham and Middleton parish council meetings take place on 6 October and 20 October respectively. You may wish to go along to meet with villagers, discuss the issues and air your views. See page 2 for times and venues.

Corby Expansion



There is a large amount of development planned for Corby borough over the next 20 to 30 years. To achieve this, whilst brown field (previously developed) sites will be used first, the scale of development proposed inevitably means that large areas of farmland will also need to be developed.

An area of land falling within Middleton and Cottingham parish boundaries (south of the A427 and west of the A6003, where the water towers are) has been included in a 'search area' for possible new housing. A more detailed map showing the extent of this search area will soon be up on the Middleton village notice board on Main Street.

An independent feasibility report has recently been completed on behalf of Corby Borough Council and we'll bring you more news in due course. In the meantime, more information about the plans for Corby can be found on Catalyst Corby's website www.catalyst-corby.co.uk and in their various publications.

Youth Facilities/BMX Track

In the last newsletter we reported on plans to develop a BMX dirt track in the village in response to requests from the Cottingham youth council.

A suitable site has now been identified on the recreation field, near to Mill Road (Bringhurst Road), and the parish council, youth council and Cllr Bob Rutt are now working together to take things forward.

Remember, Remember...

If you're planning a party for bonfire night, remember our animal friends. Dogs especially are terrified by fireworks and some even need sedating before the noise starts. So, if you're planning to have fireworks, please could you let your neighbours know and also pop the location and approximate times on the form on the village shop notice board.

Also, remember that it is now illegal to set off fireworks between 11pm and 7am, although some concessions may be made for bonfire night. This fireworks curfew carries the threat of a £5,000 fine and six months in jail, so listen out for the latest news and take heed! Bonfire night fires must be out by midnight.





And finally, if you're planning a bonfire, remember that hedgehogs often build their nests under heaps of garden rubbish. To make sure these helpful little creatures don't come to a horrific end, move your rubbish to a different location before burning. Hedgehogs cause no harm to your garden and eat slugs, snails and beetles, so it's worth looking after them!

Down in the Dale

A tree survey recently carried out in the Dale pocket park has found a couple of dangerous trees that need to be felled. Please take care if you're walking in the Dale in strong wind as there are some loose branches.

There have also been some branches deliberately torn off young trees in the Dale. Cottingham parish council knows who the culprits are and is on the case but please contact Owen Davison on 771333 if you see any vandalism taking place.

Work is currently being undertaken to get rid of weeds in the fenced off area but you'll be pleased to hear that the fencing will be gone in time for the sledging season!
