Sue Beadsworth (1943 to 2017)

Family and friends packed into St Mary Magdalene Church on 30 June to remember Sue Beadsworth, who died suddenly but peacefully on 16 June aged 74 with her family around her. Beloved wife of Mike, mum of Alison, Dawn and James, and 'Mocha' (grandmother) of Millie, Sam and Jemima, Sue was a much loved and pivotal part of the village community and she will be sadly missed by all who knew her.

Sue moved from Oxfordshire to Cottingham aged 10 when her father George Trevor took up a position as Head at the village's old school in School Lane. Following in her father's footsteps, Sue also became a teacher and herself taught at Cottingham School in the 1980s and became a foundation governor, a role she only retired from last year after more than 30 years' service! Later in her career, Sue trained to work with children with special needs and, after she retired, became a bereavement counsellor with Cruse and a counsellor at Montagu School, as well as volunteering at Kettering General Hospital. Generous and giving to the end, she was also a Lay Pastoral Minister.

Sue has been laid to rest in Cottingham churchyard.

The Annual General Meeting for the Cottingham and Middleton Village Store and Café took place on 27 June.

The shop is a non-profit making organisation and as such we are pleased to report that we improved our financial position for the year ending December 2016, making a small loss of £639, compared to a loss of £3,635 in the previous year.

The shop is now stocking some new items, mainly good quality and value meat items from Joseph Morris Butchers. This is proving very successful and orders can be taken. A new milk supplier has also been sourced to help us keep prices down for essential items (currently 90 pence a litre). We are aware that there were some teething problems with the milk which have now been sorted but, if you do have any problems with the milk or anything else you buy from the shop, please pop back in so that the team can sort it out for you.

At the AGM, various suggestions were made including home deliveries for people who aren't able to get to the shop. This is something we would very much like to provide, but we will need more volunteers if we are to put new services like this in place.

West Corby extension

In June, Cottingham and Middleton Parish Councils invited the developers behind the planned West Corby sustainable urban extension (by the water towers on the A6003) to come along to the Village Hall Annex to give villagers a summary of the plans and answer their questions.

Villagers were told that, if the planning application (reference 17/00180/OUT) is approved, the first phase of development (850 houses opposite the entrance to Danesholme) is expected to start in Spring 2019 and will take around four years. This phase would include a new primary school that would be built when the 300th new home became available. The full development of around 4,500 homes is expected to take around 20 years to complete. Garden bonfires

We all love to spend time in our gardens during the summer, but the smoke and smell from bonfires can sometimes spoil our enjoyment.



If you’re planning to burn garden waste, please be considerate to your neighbours and remember that it is actually an offence under the Environmental Protection Act 1990 to create smoke which becomes a nuisance.

If you do have a bonfire, please check with your neighbours first, only burn dry material (it’s green or moist material that creates the most smoke) and avoid damp, windless days when smoke will linger at low levels.
