Walter Campbell (1929 to 2020)

Walter Campbell sadly passed away on 1 September, aged 91. Walter was well known in the villages, having lived in Middleton most of his life. He worked on the family farm at 21 Main Street with his father Walter Swingler (Swin), and later with his wife Cecile, and also ran a doorstep milk delivery service in the villages for many years.

He leaves two daughters – Jackie and Helen – four grandchildren and three great grandchildren.

Walter had a full and active life. He leaves many happy memories and a close, loving

and growing family who will miss him very much.

News in brief

News from our Parish Councils

It's been pretty much business as usual for both our Parish Councils (PCs) since the pandemic hit in March, with meetings taking place online and members of the public, as always, welcome to attend. Here's an update on what they've been up to.

Sustainability

Joint discussions are ongoing between Cottingham and Middleton PCs and the village Copyholders regarding the future of the Round Close field on Ashley Road. Plans are being developed to plant trees on the land for coppicing in future years, which will improve the biodiversity of the area and enhance the rural landscape.

Middleton PC has also applied to join the Community Resilience Pathfinder Project run by Northants County Council. The project is aimed at developing resilience to deal with flooding resulting from heavy rainfall, offering civil engineering advice and contingency planning support. The PC is waiting to hear whether their application has been successful.

Planning

Middleton PC co-ordinated submissions to Corby Borough Council with regard to the retrospective planning application for the travellers' site in Ashley Road, which has been rejected.

Litter

Many residents raised concerns over the summer about groups gathering and leaving large amounts of litter at the Welland River near Occupation Lane, known locally as 'The 22 Foot'. This has been a popular swimming spot for many years, but the volume of litter and the breach of Covid regulations this year have made it more problematic. In addition to regular litter picks, Middleton PC has been in discussion with the farmer and has plans for signage to discourage access to the river from the footpath. The Police have dispersed groups when they have exceeded the Covid regulations.

A community litter pick is not possible this autumn, but some dedicated residents have been collecting litter regularly and we very much appreciate and applaud their efforts. If you see any fly tipping, please report it to **Corby Borough Council** on **01536 464242**, or complete the fly tipping report form on their website at corby.gov.uk.

Agricultural vehicles

As in previous years, Middleton PC wrote to local landowners asking that, wherever possible, they route large agricultural vehicles away from Main Street during harvest as the street is too narrow to accommodate them. With more people working at home this summer and more cars parked on the roadside, this has been particularly important. With a few exceptions, this request has been respected.

Overhanging gardens

Cottingham Parish Council would like to thank residents of Corby Road who have responded to the Parish Council's request to cut back overhang from their gardens. It looks much tidier and presents the village in a better light, while also allowing pedestrians and mobility scooter users to pass safely. Can any other residents with gardens overhanging the pavements please follow suit and keep the pavements clear.

Sid's is a new service coming to the villages on Thursday afternoons from 15 October, providing home delivery of locally sourced groceries, fresh fruit and veg from their van, that's kitted out as a vintage shop.

Construction begins

Elsewhere, our construction team – Mike Curtis, Tony Freeman and Simon Hempson-Medwell – have put in a lot of hard work to meet the first part of our planning and construction programme. This week, a test foundation will be completed, as required by the terms of our planning permission.

Before the Covid outbreak, we'd hoped to get this sorted by the end of August, so we're really pleased that these works have only slipped by a few weeks. It's an important step for the project as it means we'll have demonstrated that 'substantial works' have started before the planning permission expires in August 2021.



The shop committee has four new members – Sue Aspinall, David Bowman, Natalie Ryan and Audrey Teodorini. They join existing committee members Wendy Curtis, Chris Owen and Owen Davison (Chair), Anne Davison has agreed to stay on while the new committee members get settled in and Richard Haigh remains Secretary. Mary Knott has stepped down from the committee after several years' sterling service, but continues to supply the shop with delicious home made preserves.
